

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Message of Zone 1 Chair

The Sri Sathya Sai Global Council (SSSGC) is continuing to grow as more and more people become aware of its main guiding principle - Unity! The unprecedented degree of collaboration among Sai devotees across the world has been a source of learning, growth, and inspiration for all members.

Bhagawan Baba's institutions in Prasanthi Nilayam continue to set the example by providing free service to all, regardless of race, gender, religion, culture or social status. Enhanced and expedited communication with these institutions, with the SSSGC branches across all of India, and across the globe are allowing for greater exchange of knowledge, improved means for mutual support, and a sharing of resources, as well as speaker and volunteer exchanges.

The following are just a few examples:

- The Sri Sathya Sai Medical Camp offered jointly by SSSGC India and SSSGC Overseas is held twice a year in
 Prasanthi Nilayam to serve local visitors and pilgrims. This united camp affords a greater efficiency, expands
 the pool of healthcare providers, and affords more accessibility and opportunities for patients' benefit.
- The Sri Sathya Sai University provides access to teachers and resources to support centers, and hosts visiting professors.
- The Indian organization, with all of its state branches now a part of the SSSGC, has also generously provided guest speakers, learning resources, presentations and guidance to Sai Centers outside India.
- The Center Leaders Conference held in July 2023 brought together over 1300 officers to participate in talks and workshops with 40 speakers provided by the Indian branch of SSSGC and 40 speakers from the Overseas branch (which covers the entire globe). By Baba's Grace, they were privileged to participate in the first conference held at the renowned newly constructed state of the art Sai Hira Global Convention Centre.
- The Center for Human Values in Prasanthi Nilayam is providing training so that each Zone has the
 opportunity to share their resources and classes with devotees.
- The Collegium of Human Values is being set up, with representatives from across Zones to serve on the think tank and provide guidance and material for dissemination of Bhagawan's message across the globe.
- The Sri Sathya Sai Media Centre has welcomed volunteers to serve in various capacities, provided many guest speakers for programs across the globe, organized worldwide online Akhanda Bhajans with all Zones, and given assistance for media-related issues required by Zones globally. They also help guide all presentations given by visiting Zones in Prasanthi Nilayam.

Message of Zone 1 Chair (cont)

- The entire ashram, from the canteens to the accommodation offices to every aspect of ashram functions, has lovingly opened up for our benefit. They have also helped identify service projects for visiting groups to undertake, both in the ashram and in surrounding villages.
- The Young Adult Leadership Program, now into its second year and open to all YAs across the globe online, was held in 2023 and concluded with several days of learning, celebration, and performances at Prasanthi Nilayam.
- A Centenary Planning Committee has already been set up with members from across all zones to come up with plans to celebrate the 100th year of the advent of the Avatar. They will be making suggestions for the Centenary Planning Meetings to be held in the ashram in November 2023 under the guidance of the SSSGC Executive Committee.

We are most grateful to Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba for providing this collaborative venture named the Sri Sathya Sai Global Council. We pray that the entire world will soon join in unity to carry forward Bhagawan's mission to make each realize their own inner divinity.



She held both My hands and pleaded, "Swami, there is no hospital in our village. Consequently, when the children become sick, mothers are forced to carry them to Bukkapatnam. I am unable to see their suffering. My children and others' children are one and the same for me. So, kindly construct at least a small hospital in our village." I promised her that I would fulfil her wish and accordingly I built a big hospital. Easwaramma's joy knew no bounds. The whole day she did not feel the need for food and water as she felt highly contented and overjoyed. She caught hold of My hands and expressed her happiness as her wish was fulfilled in a big way.

The Very First Birthday Celebration at Puttaparthi


Saturday, November 23, 1946

"On the 23rd of November 1946, Baba's Birthday was celebrated in the Mandir (the temple with Shirdi and Parthi Sai altar) as a major festival for the first time. All the devotees proceeded to Baba's parents' house with musical instruments. They carried the Poornakumbha (sacred water pitcher) vessel, garlanded the blessed parents, offered them new clothes, performed 'Pada Puja' (worship of the Lotus Feet) to them and invited them to celebrate their Son's Birthday in the Mandir. Baba's parents were thus ceremoniously ushered into the Mandir. The stage in front of the Mandir was decorated with Rangoli (colorful floor art). Baba sat on this stage in a wonderfully ornate chair. The parents then applied sandalwood paste and Kumkum (holy red powder) on His forehead. Baba was anointed with a flower dipped in consecrated sandalwood oil and garlanded. Baba blessed the parents with Laddu Prasadam (a sanctified round sweet delicacy).

Later, the other devotees were blessed with an opportunity of anointing the Avatar, applied oil to His head, and worshipped His feet by applying turmeric and Kumkum to them. Baba blessed all these devotees by distributing laddus amongst them. After a bath, Baba sat in His chair while Bhajans were sung in devotional fervor. After the Arati, Prasadam was distributed all over again. Baba also organized a grand feast for all His devotees. The function was drawn to a close only at around 10:00 pm."

Devotee Favorite: The Birthday Jhoola (swing)

"The glory of the Sathya Sai Avatar cannot be described in words. But there are a few moments that truly stand out in the memory of each devotee. One of those moments is the annual Jhoola Mahotsavam, in which Bhagawan would most graciously and royally swing on an ornate silver Jhoola (swing) on the evening of His Birthday. Donning silk robes, He would sway gently back and forth as great singers would offer their musical tributes at His Lotus Feet for hours on end....

The 65th birthday celebrations of Bhagawan was no exception. On that glittering evening, Swami delighted the hundreds of thousands of devotees assembled in the Hill View Stadium for a full 90 minutes while soulful devotional songs were rendered by some of the stalwarts of Indian classical and light music...it was truly a sight for the gods to hear the popular composition by the famous 15th century composer Sri Annamacharya, "Jo Atchyutananda" (Sleep, dear Eternally Blissful One!), which is sung so many times in front of the Lord in Tirupati, being sung in front of Lord Venkateshwara Himself in human form! What a blessing!"






Devotee Favorite: The Birthday Jhoola (swing) (cont)







The Story of the *Jhoola*

In 1967, when Swami visited the city of Jamnagar in India's western state of Gujarat, the wealthy Rajmata of Gujarat gifted Him with a magnificent silver swing. [Swings were, and are, popular in Gujarat, in good part because of their association with Lord Krishna, who is believed to have enjoyed swings, as a child; thus swings are seen to be auspicious and to invoke His blessings.]

In his book *Sri Sathya Sai Baba: A Life*, Bill Aitken writes, "Sai Baba swings on it annually every year on His Birthday, in an elegant affirmation of the Vaishnav tradition of Kathiawad, centred in the pilgrim town of Dwarka". Dwarka is a town in Gujarat's Saurastra region and was the residence of Krishna in His later years.

The Rajmata loved Swami dearly; and proved a generous donor in the construction and development of Prasanthi Nilayam in Puttaparthi and the Whitefield ashram in Bangalore. Baba rewarded her with a house near His own at both ashrams.

A Poem for Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba

Read by N. Kasturi in the Divine Presence on October 16, 1958

Narayana Kasturi (1897-1987) was one of Swami's earliest and foremost devotees. He was Swami's biographer for many decades; the translator for His discourses and writings; editor of Sanathana Sarathi; and author of several books, including Sathyam Sivam Sundaram – The Life of Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba, as well as Prasanthi – Pathway to Peace.



Have you heard our Baba speak At public meetings anywhere? He never calls it speech; Nor will you name it so!

He does not raise His voice, harangue, Or rouse the mob or rail or flail; He does not hesitate, He will not calculate, Hum and haw and pause and ponder, Making you wonder why you came!



He does not waiver, wander, Collecting thoughts, contriving notes; He does not waste a moment, decorating thoughts in showy lace and frills, clothing borrowed texts in shimmering gauze.

He is no orator-pompous, proud, Clamoring for claps, publicity-mad! He will not circumambulate, declaim... or, even... 'speak'!



He is the rain-cloud, bringing Life
To the parched ones here below!
He 'talks'... He 'talks', to you, and you, and every
single you that has gathered there.
To every single Arjuna, with heavy heart and empty
hand,
Afraid to fight the battle of Life on to Victory.

You feel He has come for you, to you. You see Him, silently looking around! The searchlight eye full circle swings! How lucky, you are there!



He smiles; He wins you by that smile! You scarce can take your eyes from off that Face, So alluring, so Divine! You scarce can pull your heart from off His grip;

The clasp is cool comfort!
The silence deepens...
Though thousands have been squatting, waiting,
For hours and hours...
Himalayan stillness; twilight calm!

His talk is a cascade, so limpid and pure, Teaching, never preaching, unraveling all knots, Stilling the questionings ere they emerge in mind; Defining, refining, consoling the pining, Commanding, yea, demanding the bending of pride, Sparing no one, be He ruling or serving.



Chiding, reprimanding the fool, and fanatic; Joking and coaxing, poking fun at all hoaxing; Quoting from what He said in the past ages, Detailing facts of His incarnating.

Resplendent poetry, spontaneous, sublime, Painting pictures of transcendent Truth, Parable, proverb, scintillating bright, Tinkling, twinkling, tintinnabulating lilt,

Every hour a minute, every minute a second; Every word a manthra, every phrase, Suuthra, A Gayathri a sentence, Upanishath a speech!



For He is no well or tank or river! His is the ocean of Wisdom Divine! Oh! His words shower mercy, like morning dew On every heart-bud awakening from dreaming.

He is feeding your roots and speeding the sap, Sprouting the buds, painting the petals, Perfuming them well, inviting the bees, Ripening the pods, with each word of His!



There! The meaning of His word, a tiny seed Drops on your rock-like heart! And wonder of wonders!

Sifting the responding, lifting the desponding.



Stressing on 'Doing, Behaving and Living', Appealing for 'Feeling, Believing and Acting'.

Calling all listening, to spurn imitating,
Vainly disputing, blind leading the blind,
Knocking at Paradise through power and pelf,
Or boasting of branches of family tree,

And wanting and panting and hoarding and guarding.



As you hear Him talking, you quietly resolve To take a step forward on the pilgrim road; Unfold your wings and soar into the sky! You feel you are a Lion, cheated into bleating! A diamond, set in dirty lead!

Ah! What is this? What luck! What Grace! Even as He talks, 'it' blossoms into song, Oh! Captivating Song! He teaches us to pray Tranquillizing all the furious waves, Steeling the nerves and strengthening the will, Attuning our soul to *Dharma! Sathya! Prema!*

A Poem for Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba (cont)


A Bond that was Sweet and Beautiful



The Importance of Sai Centers: What Swami says

"First, it has been decided that the Sathya Sai Seva Samithi (the precursor of today's Sai Center) will hereafter be the key unit of the Organization."

Swami, Sathya Sai Speaks, Vol. 11, December 23, 1971

"The Organizations named after Me...must try to spread interest in the recitation of God's Name, meditation, and other spiritual practices which lead man Godward. They must demonstrate the Joy derivable from devotional group singing and remembrance of God's Name, and the Peace that one can draw from good company. They must render service to the helpless, the sick, the distressed, the illiterate and the needy. Their selfless service should not be exhibitionistic; it must seek no reward, not even gratitude or thanks from the recipients.

Swami, Sathya Sai Speaks, Vol.8, February 23, 1968

"We have to demonstrate to the world the unity that underlies the diversity. All should work together in harmony, act together, move together, grow together and share the common knowledge and experience with all."

Swami, Sathya Sai Speaks, Vol.20, November 24, 1987

Three of the Points in Swami's Nine Point Code of Conduct highlight the important role of Sai Centers. These include (a) participation by children in the Sri Sathya Sai Educare program, (b) participation in the community service programs of the Organization, and (c) attendance at least once a month in Center *bhajans* (devotional group singing).

Other Observations

"Sri Sathya Sai centers play an important part in transforming hearts and enlightening communities. With their roots firmly attached to Prasanthi Nilayam, the centers are like branches taking Swami's teachings to individuals, families, and communities." Representatives from every Zone, Country, and Region including Zone Chairs, National Council Presidents, Senior Leaders, Regional Coordinators, National Council Members, Members of the Institute of Sathya Sai Education, and Members of the Central Trust, and Young Adults all came together to participate in this conference.



Conference aims: Spiritually Energize Center Leaders and Strengthen Sai Centers in following Swami's

Message. The Center Leaders Conference marked an important occasion for all Sathya Sai Centers. The meeting added momentum to the efforts being undertaken in the Zones to put into practice Swami's teachings. Over two days, it spiritually energized Center leaders to strive for greater heights of spiritual awareness and selfless service implementation. Zone 1 Sai Centers: Love in Action

We asked Zone 1 Centers to highlight one or two activities each of them has undertaken over the past year. This section presents their responses, edited only slightly to retain the tenor and 'heart' with which they have been written. They are presented in alphabetical order, with the exception of the Region 1 Food Bank Service project, which appears at the end of the section, and where each participating center has submitted its own individual contribution. Do not miss the photos at the end of the report!

Atlanta, GA: Multi-Faith and Multi-Cultural Events

At the Atlanta Sathya Sai Baba Center, special attention is given to the **importance of the Multi-Faith and Multi-Cultural principles** emphasized by Swami in His talks about Unity of Faith. In the past twelve months, devotees cheerfully celebrated Christmas, Yom Kippur and Rosh Hashana alongside *Ganesh Chaturthi, Onam* and *Dasara*. Last Christmas, for example, two Christian devotees shared their experiences and insights, and the whole center enthusiastically sang lovely Christmas carols. Similarly, devotional services every Sunday start with prayers of several faiths, including Christianity, Judaism, Islam, Buddhism, and Hinduism. The weekly study circle too includes participants from various faiths and cultures; and the discussion often encompasses Swami's teachings on respect for different religions and countries.

Swami has said:

"There is only one religion, the religion of Love; There is only one language, the language of the Heart; There is only caste, the caste of Humanity; There is only one God, and He is Omnipresent."

Baltimore, MD: Center Picnic, Harvest Seva

A Center Picnic in June at a local park was the **first picnic held after four long years**, due to the pandemic, and was thoroughly enjoyed by all. A relay race kicked off the event, combining three activities—a three-legged race, lime & spoon, and a scavenger hunt using Swami's quotes. The teams were a mix of SSSE children, Young Adults and SSSE Parents. It was a fun way to practice coordination during all three activities all at once. Also on tap were value games and several others such as tug of war, badminton, volleyball, and musical chairs using bhajan music and not the least, a delicious lunch.

Harvest Seva (Service), requiring good teamwork and coordination, is a favorite volunteer activity of young and adult devotees at the Baltimore Sai Center. In both July and September, about 45-55 Center members, Young Adults and SSSE children volunteered to harvest 20,000 lbs. of cabbage and 10,000 lbs. of corn and potatoes for the needy. The Center has been volunteering to harvest vegetables twice a year at First Fruit Farm in Maryland since 2017. This farm grows a variety of vegetables and donates 100% of its produce to local soup kitchens, food banks and shelters. Over the seven years, volunteers have learned how to harvest corn, potatoes, collard greens, bell peppers, and tomatoes. However, this was the first time we harvested cabbage. Despite less rain this summer, the cabbages were fresh and large.

Canada: Inaugural Nagarsankeerthana

Numerous devotees participated in SSSGC Canada's inaugural Nagarsankeerthana, held September 4, 2023 at a park in Scarborough. Onlookers expressed their delight, some even recorded the session. Envisioned as a spiritual endeavor leading up to Swami's Centennial Birthday in November 2025, the event will continue every long weekend, except during winter months. The Center is inviting all devotees, including Sri Sathya Sai Educare children, to partake in this sacred sadhana (spiritual effort), to experience peace, happiness, and the profound bliss of Prasanthi Nilayam. A sign of the times: a young student just arrived in Toronto learned of the event through his mother in India who saw the event flyer on Facebook, then took two buses to reach Scarborough—a testament to the magnetic pull of His divine calling!

Nagarsankeerthana is a spiritual practice in which a dedicated group of devotees goes around streets or in the outdoors in the early morning, ardently singing devotional songs known as bhajans. Nagarsankeerthana in Prasanthi Nilayam is an unforgettable experience, with chirping birds, cool breezes, and lovely bhajans filling Swami's Mandir with a divine ambience.

Clearwater, FL: Gulfside Gayatri, Horseback Riding Therapy

1. Swami's boundless grace led us recently to a remarkable service opportunity at Bakas Equestrian Center, which is dedicated to providing therapeutic horseback riding sessions for children and adults with disabilities. Each therapy session requires the dedicated support of four to five volunteers for every rider. Under Swami's divine guidance, children aged 12 and above came forward to serve as sidewalkers during these equine therapy sessions. Meanwhile, our younger kids demonstrated their love and care for the magnificent horses by assisting with horse care and grooming and diligently tending to the barn's cleanliness. The service project yielded valuable lessons about selfless love, compassion, and gratitude. Please see box below for a glimpse of the children's reactions.

- ♥ Group 2: "Bakas Equestrian Center is a sanctuary of service. The horses within its care toil tirelessly each day to serve those with disabilities selflessly. In light of their noble service to the riders, our sacred duty is to ensure a clean and welcoming environment for them by diligently cleaning their stalls. We can draw parallels to Swami's love and care for his devotee and pet, Sai Geetha. Just as Swami cared for animals, we too must extend our service to them, particularly those which play a crucial role in our community, to express our heartfelt gratitude."
- Group 2: "The service activity at Bakas Center touched our hearts as we cared for and cleaned the horse barns. Unlike ordinary horses, these horses dedicate themselves to assisting people with disabilities. It was a joy and a privilege to offer our service and provide the employees at Bakas with a brief respite from their dedicated work."
- ♥ Group 3: "The Bakas Equestrian Center is a place of profound beauty, where I witnessed the blessings showered upon the horses and their profound impact on the lives of the children they serve. Through their simple acts of service, these horses become vessels of divine healing for the children. I offer my heartfelt thanks to Swami for allowing me to interact with the riders during therapy sessions, and I was overjoyed to witness the innocent smiles they brought forth."

2. Every year, at the beginning of the hurricane season, adults and children of the Clearwater Sai Center continue a tradition of chanting the Sai Gayathri at the Clearwater Beach. Devotees thank Swami for protecting them for the past 100 years, and pray for His continued Grace in

protecting the region from the devastating hurricanes. On the designated day, the group meets at sunrise at the entrance of the Clearwater beach; they hold hands and chant the prayer, then proceed to the end of the beach, chanting all the while. Everyone gathers around the water on the beach, praying and offering *Vibhuthi* to the Gulf of Mexico. Swami shows us His presence with the beautiful sunrise painting the clouds, or with the rainbow that lights up the sky on our walk back. With the collective prayer offered by the group, everyone feels the sacred vibrations and divine energy surrounding them.

Note to reader from the Clearwater Center: We hope you can join us in our annual tradition of the "Beach Gayathri" and experience the joy of Swami's Grace while praying to protect the community.

East Brunswick, NJ: Food Service, Educare

East Brunswick Sai Center has been an active participant in **several Food Service Projects**, for example, Legion of Good Will (LGW), to provide meal kits to children and families in NJ. We also collect and deliver food and School Supplies & Uniforms to the children of Asbury Park as part of the Asbury Park Meal Kit Seva. Additionally, we collect food ingredients and gather around 6:30 AM to cook food and distribute in the Trenton area for the Urban Food Alliance Seva. In a similar fashion, we collaborate with other centers and actively participate in the Plainfield Open Market Seva. We collect food items and distribute it to the needy in the area.

East Brunswick Sai Center leads and actively participates in several initiatives of the Sri Sathya Sai Program for Human Values and Educare (SSSPAVE). Group 4 SSSE children, Young Adults, and adults take part in the Academic Coaching and Tutoring program to provide free weekly tutoring and mentoring for students in K through 10 grades primarily in Math, English and Sciences. They help students strengthen their subject knowledge and boost their self-confidence, set achievable goals, acquire their full potential, and gain leadership skills to be successful in life. The Center also holds English Classes (English as a Second Language) for non-English speaking adults, both online and in-person; more than 20 students are registered in this program. In-person Sri Sathya Sai Educare (SSSE) classes, meanwhile, following the Covid pandemic have led to to better engagement between Children/Parents and Gurus, while YAs' Gurus training has significantly increased their involvement, including the teaching of SSSE across all groups.

Indianapolis, IN (Region 5): Sai Alumni Meet-His Property Without Borders

"Come together, spend time with each other and spread ANANDA amongst each other" were Bhagawan's words during the first meet in 2009 of the alumni of the Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Learning. Abiding by the divine Chancellor's instructions, the alumni of Swami's Institutions residing in North America meet annually in different parts of North America. This year the meet, named **Sai NAAM (North America Alumni Meet)** took place in Indianapolis, Indiana-Region 5.

Alumni of Anantapur, Puttaparthi, and Brindavan Institutions took to air and road to meet the Divine Call, eager to Re-live, Re-collect, Re-connect, and Re-energize, as hailed in the motto of the event. Sai brothers and sisters from America and Canada, ranging in age from 20+ to 60+, were privileged to literally live the life of a Sai Student for a day. Alumni and devotees from the Indianapolis Sai Center joined hands to decorate Swami's altar and chair. Beginning with Suprabhatam and Nagarsankeerthan on a brisk, windy morning at the local temple, the Big Day was filled with Alma Mater sessions and various shows of support and gratitude to the Alma Mater. The program comprised alumni talks and experience sharing, discussions on how to support the institution, heart touching bhajans and an enthralling Musical Offering to Bhagawan by the alumnis' renowned and most humble musical group. Distinguished alumnus Brother R.J Rathnakar applauded Bhagawan's love for humanity; the group was also privileged to have a Q&A discussion with the Institute's Vice Chancellor Brother Raghavendra Prasad, who was the Chief Guest for the event.

Rochester, NY: Joined the Sri Sathya Sai Global Council family New center!

With Swami's grace on the auspicious occasion of 2023 Holy Guru Purnima, SSSGC Rochester, NY - USA of the Northeast Region 1, lovingly and excitingly joined the Sri Sathya Sai Global Council family in the spirit of unity and connectivity to Prasanthi Nilayam. This new center expressed their immense gratitude to Dear Swami by offering a letter which, with His Grace, was placed and propitiously blessed at Swami's Sannidhi in Sai Kulwant Hall on Guru Purnima. To mark this special inaugural occasion including the wonderful support of the SSSGC Sai Leadership team, the Rochester Center hosted a special Satsang with SSSGC-USA National Devotional Coordinator Dr. Dhurjati Mudigonda. Brother Dhurjati offered a beautiful musical treat of Sai experiences and Bhajans on the Veena, and also spoke on the importance of connecting to Prasanthi Nilayam as we all continue our spiritual sadhana and journey to Sai.

Syracuse, NY: Talk by Brother Fize Mohamed from Trinidad

In August 2023 the Syracuse Sai Center hosted **Brother Fize Mohamed from Trinidad.** He shared with us his transformative encounters with Baba both from a distance and in Baba's presence. His quest to truly know God, beyond religion and what he was told by elders and religious scholars, led him to the divine feet of Baba over many years. Numerous miraculous incidents occurred including Baba saving his life in a head-on car collision which left him unconscious in the hospital for several days, with little prospect of recovery. It was Baba's Grace that saved him and when he went for his first interview, Baba told him he drove too fast—possibly a reminder for all to "start early, drive slowly and arrive safely", as Swami says. Brother Fize noted that Baba completely erased the memory of the accident; he only knows of it from the passengers in the car. Many other experiences were shared on how Baba came to the rescue of not only Brother Fize but also others, by making him an instrument to serve those in need.

Jersey City, NJ: Selfless Food Service, Blissful Summer Picnic

The Jersey Sai Center undertakes significant **food service** activities: devotees get together on a Saturday to prepare, pack, and deliver meals to a nearby church where some 70-80 people in need line up for a warm, nutritious, and sanctified lunch made with love and devotion. The accompanying box offers a closeup look at the activity and conveys a sense of the volunteers' warmth and enthusiasm.

Transformative Selfless Service at Jersey City Sai Center

On a bright Saturday morning at 8:30 am, a vibrant sense of devotion and enthusiasm fills the air as devotees gather to engage in yet another seva (service) at *Shirdi Seva Asthaan* in West Orange, NJ. Volunteers eagerly line up to unload food materials from their cars, including snack bars, bananas, fresh bread from the bakery, and groceries for the day's meals, encompassing pasta, spaghetti, sauces, and an assortment of spices.

Welcoming everyone with a warm smile is Nelli aunty, the main chef overseeing the precise combination of ingredients for delicious dishes. The sanctity of the atmosphere is established with the chanting of three OMs before diving into the food preparation process. Approximately 10 to 15 seva volunteers contribute to various tasks, from boiling pasta, making pasta sauce, cutting vegetables and garnishing garlic bread to cooking meals. The food menu features a variety of options, including pasta, mac & cheese, burgers, ziti, vegetable balls, and chili beans. Simultaneously, hot tea is prepared and served to the diligent volunteers.

While the cooking unfolds, some volunteers organize tables to prepare for the packing of meals into to-go containers. Others busy themselves unfolding bags to hold the food, snack bars, bananas, and water bottles. All the freshly prepared food items are neatly lined up on the tables.

First box is prepared and kept in front of our beloved Swami for his blessing through Brahmarpanam, the food prayer. The volunteers then line up to start packing the boxes passing hand by hand, while adding the snacks, bananas, water and any special food item for the day that goes into the bag.

We prepare approximate 70 to 80 to-go boxes and load into cars, ready to be transported to the nearby Holy Trinity Episcopal Church. Upon arrival at church, a heartwarming scene unfolds as a line of hungry individuals stands outside the church. Their eyes express gratitude as they open the boxes and enjoy the nourishing meals. The church staff and volunteers are ever grateful to the selfless service done by the Sai team.

Words fall short in describing the joy of participating in this seva, and immense gratitude is expressed to Bhagawan, our beloved Sai, for allowing us to be instruments of service to the needy. The Jersey City Sai Center consistently provides opportunities for all center members, including SSE children, their parents, friends, and families, to engage and volunteer in various service activities conducted on a daily, weekly, monthly, quarterly, and yearly basis.

On a sunny day in August 2023, the Jersey City Sai Center embarked on a joyous journey to Van Saun Park in Paramus, NJ, turning an ordinary Sunday into an extraordinary summer picnic. Warm weather set the perfect stage for a day of companionship, spirituality, and shared laughter. The 50-person gathering commenced with Om and Gayatri chants to lay the foundation for a day of positive energy. Good food, good sports, and the park's offerings engaged all—kids, young adults, and adults—alike. Post-lunch, devotees joined in a spirited game of *Antakshari*, with Sai bhajans filling the air creating an atmosphere of harmony and spiritual connection. The grand finale was a soulful singing of Sai bhajans, followed by impromptu performances of members from various religious backgrounds, embodying a spirit of unity in diversity. Not only a treasured memory, the picnic highlighted the power of shared spirituality, social gathering, and time spent together strengthening bonds of friendship and community outside the setting of the Sai Center.

Loudoun, VA: Sandwich program, Nature Walk, Sathya Sai Vratam Pooja

With Swami's Grace, the Loudoun Sai Center conducted a Center-Wide Service Activity involving SSSE Students and Parents and all Center Members, bringing the whole center together as one family. Sandwiches were packed and delivered for lunch for a Community Shelter, and Brown Bags were packed and delivered to Community School Lunch. It was heartwarming to see all center members come together and offer their time for the community, in the name of Swami. SSSE Group 2 children helped pack items along with their Gurus. As part of the annual picnic, SSSE children also went on a **nature walk** and throughout the walk discussed quotes of Swami about nature. Among other things, they learned the importance of Mother Nature, how she safeguards us, how not to trouble her, and how to live in harmony.

In August, the Loudoun Sai Center performed *Samuhika Sri Sathya Sai Vratam Kalpamu* as one Sai Family, with participation by all center members including SSSE children. Families came together, individually performed *pooja* as instructed, collectively offered it at Swami's Lotus Feet for the welfare of the community, and received Swami's *Maha Prasadam*.

Mesa, AZ: Preparing for Swami's 100th Birthday

In honor of Swami's 100th birthday, a heartfelt effort has been under way, comprising the learning of the *Sri Sathya Sai Suprabhatam* and the organization of Walk for Values/Nagar Sankeertan. During the summer holidays, a fifth batch of students dedicated themselves to mastering the Suprabhatam. Upon completion of the learning sessions, the students along with a few others visited a senior home to perform a moving collection of multi-faith prayers and songs for the residents. The music's enchanting quality left the senior home's inhabitants captivated, leading to an invitation for a return visit during their "Christmas in July" event. At this second visit, the group spread joy, cheer, and Swami's Love by singing Christmas songs.

The efforts to honor the 100th Birthday were further enriched by the organization of four Walk for Values/Nagar Sankeertan events. As a part of these gatherings, Young Adults organized entertaining activities for center members not engaged in walking. Participants have enjoyed these activities; and these events have radiated an infectious sense of joy, prompting bystanders—human and animal—to wonder about the source of such exuberance at such an early hour.

Orlando, FL: Service Activities for the needy, Devotional Program for Self-Transformation

The Orlando Sai Center has been engaged in some wonderful service activities for the past year thus far. Members have actively participated with dedication, love, and devotion:

- ▶ In April, as part of our *Aradhana* Service project, members of the Orlando Sai Center had the great opportunity of preparing 50 dental kits for the residents of **the Orlando Rescue mission**, a home where aid is provided to the helpless, hungry and the homeless. Members also generously donated cereals and canned items.
- Since July, the Center has also been donating cooked food, canned goods, toiletries and dried goods to the Russell Home of Orlando for Atypical children. Members meet at the Center on scheduled Saturdays to make peanut butter sandwiches; some members prepare cooked foods like pasta dishes which are then delivered to the home. There is also an ongoing collection of needed items which are delivered monthly.
- ▼ The center is also taking part in the Sri Sathya Sai Prema Tharu project, an initiative to "adorn Mother Earth with 10 million trees by Bhagawan's Birth Centenary in 2025". Some devotees have already planted trees and uploaded their pictures. A marigold tree will also be planted on November 18 at the Orlando Sai Center as part of this project.
- ▼ The Center has had an excellent devotional program focused on self-transformation and building confidence through faith. Through Samarpans from Prashanthi and weekly study circles, we are focusing on ways to achieve inner transformation, including: offering all our actions to Swami; practicing constant integrated awareness as well as self-introspection; seeing all beings as one; and understanding who we are. We also continue our weekly center sadhana of Gayatri chanting and Jyothi meditation for world peace.

South Bethesda, MD: Celebration of Festivals and Avatar Day

The South Bethesda Sai Center celebrated *Ganesh Chaturthi* and *Krishna Janmasthami* (birthdays of Lord Ganesha and Lord Krishna) in a grand manner. Both celebrations started with *Vedam* chanting followed by an uplifting study circle. The *Krishna Janmasthami* study circle on "Radha *Bhakti* and Meera *Bhakti*" focused on the divine love of Radha and Meera, among Krishna's foremost devotees. The *Ganesh Chaturthi* study circle focused on the "Significance of OM" which Swami says is the verbal symbol of God and the one sound from which all other sounds arise. *Avatar Day in* October included a highly inspiring talk by Dr Panchanathan titled "In every moment of my life please be with me", while SSSE children enacted a scene where the 14-year old Sathya makes His announcement that had been held back so long, "I am Sai Baba". The play was followed by uplifting bhajans!

West Palm Beach, FL: Special Speaker, Helping the Homeless

A study circle in August featured a special speaker, **Sister Padmaja Malayala**. Sister Padmaja is the niece of Shri B. V Raman Rao, who served Baba for several decades and was one of the foremost coordinators of Puttaparthi's *Seva Dal* (volunteer corps). Sister Padmaja offered a bhajan to Swami, then recounted several of her grandfather's and uncle's experiences as well as her own, linking her remarks beautifully with the attributes of Swami as described in the *Sathya Sai Ashtotra Satha Namavali* (108 Names of Swami). Dr. Sastry Pappu (a pioneer of the study circle in the Sathya Sai organization and also a part of our study circle group) then narrated

his own experiences with Raman Rao *garu* and remembered him as Hanuman to Lord Rama for all the service he did in the name of our beloved lord "Sai Rama". Sister Padmaja received much appreciation for sharing such beautiful experiences.

The aim of the "Helping the Homeless" project is to support the homeless people in nearby communities through food donation and hygienic items and arranging temporary stay for people in need. To promote healthy eating, protein and nutrient-based foods are served along with other regular items like Pasta, Spanish Rice, Cookies, fruits, water etc. Utmost care is taken to serve the food with love, engage the homeless people in conversation and find out, and provide, the help needed, including with respect to hygienic items. Occasionally, and as called for, the Center provides financial assistance for families on a waiting list for housing placement and in need of temporary accommodation. The West Palm Beach Center's other service projects include Park Cleanup and a Back-to-school "Bash" program.

Region 1 SSSGC-USA Special Service Project: Regional Food Bank Service

With the Blessings of Bhagawan Baba, the Sri Sathya Sai Global Centers of Region 1 put a focused spotlight on food insecurity and hunger awareness. Coinciding with the National Food Bank and Hunger Awareness month in September, SSSGC Region 1 Sai centers of Norwalk, Scarborough, Shelton, Syracuse, Scarsdale, Rochester all participated in this Regional Food Bank Service.

Food is a basic necessity. We often take food for granted yet many families around us unfortunately struggle with food insecurity challenges. Harsh statistics reveal to us that millions of people suffer from food scarcity and it's still an ongoing problem of hunger. As soon as the Regional Food Bank Service Project initiative was discussed by the service coordinators, in no time the devotees sprung into immediate action and looked into opportunities to self-lessly serve the vulnerable populations. They wanted to do something positive and make a clear difference to help alleviate hunger. Observing the hunger adversities and physically seeing homeless people living on the streets, Sai members were gifted an opportunity by Dearest Swami to rise and take action with love and humility. Members saw the plight of individuals using a grocery cart to literally carry and store all their belongings like clothes, cans, bedding - that was their lifeline. All the Northeast Region 1 Sai centers felt a spirit of kindred unity in carrying out similar food pantry service projects during the same time in their respective communities.

Our loving Lord Swami has often emphasized Narayana Seva as one of the best Seva activities to feed the hungry, or "Narayana's". Narayana Seva means serving Narayana or serving the Lord. **Swami says**, "The gift of food is the noblest of all gifts." In fact, the humble devotees of Region 1 Sai centers drew their inspiration from hearing and seeing Bhagawan Baba Himself serving in Narayana Seva activities taking place in Prasanthi Nilayam. The service enthusiasts whole-heartedly participated in the food bank seva and felt immense gratitude to Swami for providing this blessed opportunity. They even reached out and encouraged friends in the greater community to also participate. Swami says, "A wave of service, if it sweeps over the land catching everyone in its enthusiasm, will be able to wipe off mounds of hatred, malice and greed that infest the world."

Through their active engagement in Sai Service, SSSGC Sai Centers of Region 1 have very lovingly supported the families lacking in basic food and amenities. Here are a few glimpses from all the SSSGC Sai centers in Region 1 and may all be inspired to adopt the same goal of pleasing our Dearest Bhagawan.

Zone 1 Sai Centers: Love in Action (cont)

SSSGC Norwalk Sai Center (CT)

Norwalk Sai Center earnestly participated in the **Regional Service Project** on occasion of Food Bank Awareness in September. It was a wonderful collaboration with a Person-to-Person non-profit organization, to help humanity and walk on the Sai path of helping and serving all.

Additional Service Highlights:

The Center has been lovingly serving the soup kitchen of **Norwalk Open Door Shelter** for more than 20 years by sponsoring lunch on the 4th Saturday of each month. Due to Covid-19 restrictions, serving was not allowed on site yet the members continued to donate pizzas. After Covid and going forward, Center members can serve in person, with all their enthusiasm.

SSSGC Scarsdale Sai Center (NY)

Devoted members of the Scarsdale Sai group also participated in the "Regional Service Food Pantry" project helping to support the vulnerable by collaborating with HOPE Community Services located in New Rochelle, NY. **HOPE's Food Pantry** is one of the largest in Westchester County. HOPE's Soup Kitchen serves about 100 meals each week night where every guest is warmly welcomed and treated with dignity and respect. The Sai team provided fresh perishables to the community, including, for example, 300lbs each of tomatoes, bananas, and potatoes.

Additional Service Highlights:

Among other activities, the SSSGC Scarsdale Center **joined with the Manhattan Center** to provide 250 T-shirts, cookies, assembly of nuts, and oranges to the underserved community in NY city.

SSSGC Scarborough Sai Center (ME)

By Swami's grace, in October the Scarborough Sai Center donated about 100 peanut butter and jelly sandwiches as well as a large collection of non-perishable items to the **Prebel Street Food Pantry hub** in support of the Regional Food Bank Seva. Devotees lovingly attached Swami's quotes to all the sandwich bags as part of the community outreach advocated by the Sri Sathya Sai Program for Awareness of Human Values (SSSPAVE). They also prepared ziplock bags with healthy goodies along with a drink to hand over to homeless people encountered on the way.

Additional Service Highlights:

SSSGC Scarborough Sai Center, Maine also dedicated their time and efforts by participating in **SSSPAVE Seva!** Over 200 sandwiches were made and specially included were universal quotes. Additional post cards with quotes were distributed to all. Center members had lovely musical interactions with the elderly residents, which was touching for all. One such rendition was of the timeless song, "This little light of mine, I'm gonna let it shine. Let it shine, let it shine, let it shine!", chosen to underscore the importance of shining one's light in the world, and the impact that even the smallest light can have everywhere you go!

Zone 1 Sai Centers: Love in Action (cont)

SSSGC Shelton Sai Center (CT)

On the Holy occasion of Krishna Janmashtami, Shelton Sai Center enthusiastically reached out to the nearby subregional Sai centers, and all lovingly participated in the **Food Bank Regional Seva.** Much needed pantry items were donated by devotees, collected, and delivered to the food pantry. Donations were made to Spooner House, indeed so many in number that some excess supplies were donated to another homeless shelter, namely, Bridgeport Rescue Mission, another homeless shelter providing meals and safe housing to the residents.

Additional Service Highlights:

In September the Center's SSSE Group 4 children took part in the homeless shelter Seva activity. What a great way to start the academic school year with a Sai Service project! They served meals and pizza to **Columbus House Seva** (Homeless Shelter in New Haven, CT) serving 80 people. Center families served food at Columbus House, a homeless shelter in New Haven, serving pizza, salad, fruit and cookies.

SSSGC Syracuse Sai Center (NY)

On a beautiful fall day, **Food Bank Seva** took front row center as part of the Regional Service Project from Syracuse Sai Center! Over two to three weeks, loving devotees donated food bank pantry items and collaborated with the Food Bank of Central New York, located in Syracuse. The Food Bank supports 11 counties with a population of around 140,000 residents who are in desperate need. Nearly one out of eight individuals is food insecure in central New York. The Center arranged for the pantry donations to support those less fortunate and help eliminate hunger for Syracuse community.

Additional Service Highlights:

Syracuse Sai Center also regularly takes part in **monthly pizza Seva** to the underserved at Oxford Home. This project has been going on strong for over 25+ years!

SSSGC Rochester Sai Center (NY)

The Rochester Sai **food bank service activity** was conducted in support of the Regional Seva Project-National Food Bank during September. The intent was to provide nutritious items that are high in protein (legumes, protein pasta), whole grain (granola bars, oats), low sodium (veg cans, kidney beans, garbanzo), and low sugar (no sugar added fruit cans), for both healthy impact and good taste. Located in downtown Rochester, the People's Pantry caters to the underserved population, providing groceries to families and individuals to help mitigate the effects of food insecurity. Community members can come in and choose their needed items from this pantry. The service activity provided food/household items for 60 families; it was inspiring to see committed, dedicated volunteers and staff helping to get food to the people in need.

Prema Dhara: When God Loves

The theme of this Birthday issue, Sai Hamara Hum Sai Ke (Sai is ours, we are His), is perhaps best exemplified in the unique and intimate relationship between Swami and his earliest devotees. At a time when the Sai Avatar was just unfolding and relatively few had come into the Sai fold, these fortunate devotees embraced Swami, at once as both the Divine Lord and one of their own family members. Swami, for His part, showered His abundant Love and Grace on them, drawing them close to His divine bosom and becoming one of them. He guided them and took care of all aspects of their lives, be they mundane or momentous—all the while teaching them how to live a spiritual life.

The book *Prema Dhara* (Stream of Divine Love) beautifully captures these sweet interactions between the Lord and these early devotees, laying out the "love affair" that took the form of letters, poems, and messages—and even the odd drawing—that Swami sent to His devotees. These letters afford a rare and precious look at the personal and loving messages sent by no less than the Lord Himself to His dear devotees.



A Few Observations: When God Loves...

The letters are a delight, a sheer pleasure to peruse. More than anything, they offer a window into what God's Love, pure and profuse, feels like.


A motherly love. First and foremost, the letters highlight Swami's deep love and concern for His devotees, as well as the very familiar and informal nature of their relationship. They convey the affection of a caring mother or father, making sure that everything is right with the child. In his characteristically meticulous manner, even in those early days, Swami would take care of every small logistical detail, and provide specific instructions on all matters to ensure that the devotee would face no inconvenience or problems. Indeed, no effort was too big or too small for Swami to get directly involved for his devotees, a sign of His great love for them and His own humility.

A one-to-one bond. The letters also attest to Swami's one-on-one relationship with devotees. Swami used to make it a point to deal directly and know all the members of each family, mindful of the particular needs of each, from the grandparents to the youngest children. Thus, His letters would always include a kind enquiry and specific message for each individual of the family. With the benefit of foresight, we know that throughout His avataric years, Swami continued to follow the principle of dealing directly and uniquely with each devotee.

A mutual yearning. Equally, these letters show how eager Swami was to be in the midst of his devotees and how much he missed them in their absence. While it is often said that spiritual seekers need to have a strong yearning for God to attain Him, here was Swami who longed for the company of His followers! In the second excerpt below, the Lord of the Universe is almost pleading with a devotee to visit him. Recent residents of Puttaparthi, including His students, have also talked of His sadness to see them leave, bearing witness again to His humility.

An Avatar's unique role. The letters also reveal the two-fold nature of Swami's interactions with His devotees—on the one hand, walking and talking with human beings as one among them, and on the other, fulfilling His mission as the Kali Yuga Avatar. Thus, even while dealing with his devotees on a very casual, down-to-earth basis, Swami frequently conveyed important spiritual messages in these letters. This was increasingly the case as Swami began to focus more and more on His spiritual mission, with His letters often entirely devoted to His teachings. A key message that Swami gave his followers was to have deep faith in God and recite His name always, to help carry them through the inevitable difficulties of life.



The Divine Letters

Excerpts from some of the letters themselves make up the remaining portion of this article.

CARE OF A PATIENT: To Subbama garu

"I returned to Puttaparthi today itself. I have made all arrangements for you. I have paid Rs. 150 to Venkataramana towards room rent. Rs. 20 to be paid to you. I have paid Rs. 10 to the servant maid. For your return charges I have paid Appa Rao and entrusted the task with him. I was told that you cannot travel by car after discharge from the hospital....you can stay at Venkataramana's house and return only after taking rest for two days. You need not worry on any account. I have made all the arrangements for you personally before leaving...I am keeping under my personal custody your baggage with jampala, saris, and others. Be happy I have kept some *prasadam* in this for you. Warn the servant maid to take care of your property and inform her that this is my directive to her...Come to Puttaparthi with Appa Rao. With blessing, Baba garu."

BABA'S FRIENDLY CONCERN: To Mr. Thirumal Rao

"I observed from your letter that you could not come for want of a car... if you inform me well in advance, I will arrange a car or any other comfortable alternative, and send either Yadalam Narayana or anyone of our people to Makkajepalli Station....I will send you with Basavaraju car when you want to return. I write this letter with greatest hope that you will come. It is already six months passed since I saw you last. Therefore if you write to me immediately on seeing this letter about the date of your coming, I shall surely send a car to Makkajepalli station to meet you.

I write this letter with greatest hope. Surely you must come (reminds one of the bhajan "Sai, Aana hi padega") without fail. Please tell this to Pushpamma and ask her to give consent for your coming here. Since it would be difficult for them to come by train, you can bring them next time when the car comes here. Inform this to Kamalamma and also convey my blessings. Convey my blessings to Vanitha and Naga Prasad. Inform Pushamma that I have remembered her many a time and convey my blessings to her. It would be a great pleasure. You

should come under any circumstances; whatever work you may have. Do not hesitate because you do not have a car. You should send a telegram before you leave". With blessings, Sri Sathya Sai Baba garu" 20th July, 1947, PD, pages 20-21

COME FOR ONE DAY AT LEAST: To Sri Chidambaraiah garu

"It is my desire that you should also visit and derive the pleasure of the divine grace. It is also a long time since you have visited Prasanthi Nilayam. In case you are busy otherwise, come here for one day at least. I will make all arrangements for your stay; hence do come. I bless you to have good health. With blessing, Baba garu." PD, pages 30-31

BABA LIKES TO MEET ONE AND ALL: To dear devotee Sankaramma

"Child, your message gave me immense happiness. But for me, my recent trip has not given me any satisfaction. Not being able to talk to everyone, not being able to meet everyone. I have not been happy. This time when your house is completed, I will immediately come and spend many days happily......to hear again that your sister-in-law had pain filled me with sympathy. Slowly it will decrease. She will be bedridden for 4 to 5 months. Do not get scared. Your husband too will get cured, gradually. Convey my blessings to your sister-in-law, your brother Kesava Rao's family, the doctor's family, and bhajan singer girls. With blessings, Yours truly, Sri Sathya Sai Baba garu."






This article deals with *Prema Dhara*, Volume 3, September 2009, compiled by the Sri Sathya Sai Sadhana Trust, Publications Division, comprising 103 letters written by Swami to devotees going back to the year 1946. Some are in the Telugu script, some are in English, and some are transliterated by Swami into English. The volume is unique as it contains scanned copies of actual letters, many of which are in His own handwriting. All the excerpts and photos in this article are drawn from this book. The first two volumes of *Prema Dhara* contain letters from Swami addressed to college students.

Insights from the Sri Sathya Sai Ashtotram (108 Names)







"God will never give you up, nor should you ever give up your hold on God."

The Sri Sathya Sai Ashtotram is a garland of 108 Names written in praise of our Lord, Sri Sathya Sai Baba. The Names, no doubt not exhaustive, put into words the divine qualities of the Avatar. Many of these Names echo the sentiments embedded in the phrase "Sai Hamara", the feeling that Sai is ours, He is on our side, He is there for us, He looks out for us, He makes sure we stay on the right path, He protects us, He teaches us, He will do whatever is good for us.

This section highlights three such Names, with beautiful accompanying incidents or stories that offer a glimpse of how these attributes of Divinity play out in our daily lives. The attributes featured below are:

Anaatha Naathaaya Namaha – the One who is the Guardian and Lord of the destitute Kalusha Viduraaya Namaha – the One who removes the faults and blemishes in us Karunaakaraaya Namaha – the One who is compassionate

Om Sri Sai Anaatha Naathaaya Namaha (no. 39)

Salutations to Sri Sai, who is the Guardian and Lord of the destitute

In Marathi there is a proverb which says, 'One who does not have anybody in this world, he has God'. God is the Guardian of every living being in this world, so indeed nobody is a destitute. But when human beings neglect such souls, the latter develop a feeling that they are orphans. But Bhagawan Baba's name 'Sai Baba' itself indicates that He is the Divine Mother and Father. He nurtures the world and looks after those who are helpless.

Even since His childhood, Swami always helped the poor and the downtrodden, gave them food and clothes and served them all the time. Later, this was transformed into 'Narayan seva'. Now Swami's devotees from all over the world participate in this seva. Since the 'Sathya Sai Sevadal' came into existence, every active worker has got involved in serving others and thinks himself to be blessed for getting this opportunity. Whenever there is a natural calamity, Swami's devotees from all over the world lend a helping hand to all those who have suffered by becoming instruments in the Divine Hands.

Insights from the Sri Sathya Sai Ashtotram (108 Names) (Cont)

Here is a story from foreign shores. A lady devotee of Swami from abroad was always involved in feeding and helping the poor and the downtrodden. Once due to heavy rains and floods, she was unable to visit a particular area. During those eight days, she continuously invoked Swami and prayed to Him to look after those helpless people. She was very concerned about their well-being. After eight days, the situation eased and it became possible for her to visit the place. She carried food and medicines, along with Swami's photographs and vibhuti packets, to distribute among the people.

On reaching there, she realized that everyone was safe and secure. She started distributing food packets and Swami's photographs and noticed that, on seeing the photographs, all those persons started talking among themselves. When she enquired, she was told that in her absence the person from the photograph used to come and give food and medicines to all of them! They thought Him to be her assistant helper! On hearing this, she was choked with emotion. She told them about Swami and all of them offered their heartfelt gratitude to the *Anaatha Natha* (Lord of the destitute) Sri Sathya Sai.

Om Sri Sai Kalusha Viduraya Namaha (no. 47)

Salutations to Sri Sai, who removes the faults and blemishes in all of us

When Bhagawan draws His devotees closer to Him, He removes their faults and weaknesses. This enables the devotees to carry out their duties in the right manner. Can our faults remain hidden from Bhagawan Baba? Right from His childhood, He was very particular that everyone should stay away from bad habits. Here is a story that highlights this aspect.

Swami was just eight years old at the time. A well-known person living in Puttaparthi had a bad habit of collecting friends and gossiping with them all day long. Little Sathya noticed this fault and He also knew its bad effects; the person indulging in gossip himself becomes idle and makes others idle too. Sathya found a remedy for this. He composed a song and taught it to His friends. When this group of people were sitting around and indulging in gossip, the children would go in their vicinity and sing the song.

The song conveyed to the listeners:

'Oh! Elderly people, Your behaviour is not ethical.

If you don't follow righteousness, Your friends will hate you,
They will leave you, and may even beat you'....

After hearing the song, the main culprit became uneasy but by and by, all of them grasped the truth behind it and improved their ways. Sathya composed many similar poems and skits in which He highlighted the defects prevailing in society. One very popular skit composed by little Sathyam was called 'Cheppinatlu Chestara?' which means, 'Do they do what they say?' In other words, is there unity of thought, word, and deed?

Om Sri Sai Karunaakaraya Namaha (no. 48)

Salutations to Sri Sai, who is compassionate.


One of the qualities of divine incarnations is 'karuna'. They are supremely compassionate and respond to a devotee's call, shower compassion on him and grant him bliss. The present Sri Sathya Sai Avatar is Himself the source of all compassion and His devotees have always experienced this grace. Here is a story from Chennai, which tells us how compassionate Swami is.

A few years ago, a manufacturing unit at Chennai signed a contract with a Korean firm to manufacture and supply railway wagons. The wagons had to be delivered in a stipulated timeframe. But the non-cooperation of the factory workers resulted in a delay. As the last day neared, a Korean officer arrived in Chennai and booked a cargo ship to carry the consignment. But the wagons were not ready. Since it was not going to be possible to execute the contract on time, the executive in charge was very worried and, being an ardent Sai devotee, started praying fervently to Swami. The stress caused him to fall ill, but somehow he managed to write a letter to Bhagawan Baba, praying to Him for His compassion. He gave the letter to a subordinate officer to personally give to Baba.

At the time, Swami was staying in a bungalow at Anantapur. When the officer reached there, letter in hand, he saw Swami emerging from the main door. Baba was walking through the crowd and blessing the devotees. As He walked on, He kept tying knots in the handkerchief in His hand. Swami came near the officer and, seeing the letter in his hand, said, "Why are your superiors worried? The ship will reach only when the wagons are ready and all their problems will be solved." As He said this, He pulled two corners of the knotted handkerchief and all the knots opened up. For a few moments, He looked at the sky, moved His finger as if writing something in the air, and walked away.

At that very moment, a storm appeared in the sea and the ship was unable to reach Chennai as scheduled. The ship was also damaged in the storm and needed repairs. To top it all, when it finally arrived near the port, due to heavy traffic there was a further delay of four days before it could be anchored at port. In this manner, the ship reached Chennai after a delay of one month. By this time the wagons were ready. Swami's compassion alone had saved the devotee from disgrace!

We all sing the popular bhajan *Sai Hamara Hum Sai Ke* with much fervor. But what do we mean when we sing those words? We asked SaiLights readers and share with you a few responses from across the Zone.

Sai Hamara Hum Sai Ke Aisa Prem Hamara Sai Ram Hamara Sai Ram Hamara Sathya Sai Hai Naam Tumhara Shirdi Sai Avatara [Sai Ram ...] Hindu Muslim Sikh Isai Sab Ka Palanhaara [Sai Ram ...]

O Lord Sai, we belong to You and You are verily ours; this is the loving relationship that we share; Glory to You, O Lord Sai Ram, You are ours. Praise be to Lord Sathya Sai who is the Avatar of Shirdi Sai and who is the nourisher and protector of Hindus, Muslims, Sikhs and Christians.

Every Sai devotee who has heard or sung this high energy, upbeat bhajan inevitably falls in love with it. I was no exception. The first time I heard the bhajan in the Houston Sathya Sai Center, I was mesmerized by the words, their meaning, and the intensity of emotions with which people sang this bhajan. And this was even before I sang it myself.

I had the good fortune to hear this bhajan sung in many places and eventually got a chance to sing it. Some years ago, we were having an informal conversation with the head priest at Sri Siva Vishnu Temple. He told us he was going to visit Tirupati, and we asked him to offer our prayers to the Lord. He instantly said, "Tappakunda" (of course), "Aina mana vaadu" (He is our guy). His use of the word vaadu made us laugh - one often gives God a lofty rank in terms of address, and the use of such a word, which one would use only for a male sibling, buddy, or someone who required no formality or respect, was completely unexpected. But it highlighted the degree of intimacy that the priest felt with the Lord.

Similarly, in the Sai Aarthi there is a line "Mari antayu neevé" (mother father teacher god, you alone are all that). "Neevé" is the familiar and informal version of "you", equivalent to the French "tu" as opposed to "vous", for example. While I to this day use the formal "meeré" because I grew up addressing God as "meeru" and cannot now bring myself to say "neevé", the point to note is that the composer of the song saw fit to use the more intimate "you".

For me, "Sai Hamara Hum Sai Ke" is about intimacy with the Lord. He is ours, on our side, our man, our guy. We can take any liberty with Him, we can always count on Him, He is always looking out for us, will do anything for us. He loves us unconditionally. We can ask anything of Him, as we would our mother. That is Sai Hamara - He is ours, period.

In a group bhajan setting, one further realizes that all present are feeling the same intimacy with the Lord. It is not Sai *Mera* (mine); we are collectively singing Sai *Hamara*—one cannot but feel a sense of unity with every other person in the bhajan—we are *all*, each of us, saying He belongs to us. It brings us closer, we are walking the spiritual path together, it is a shared experience.

A last thought. The "Hum Sai Ke" is literally true, in other words, we belong to God, we, indeed all of creation, are born of Him. Beyond that, "Hum Sai Ke" suggests to me a certain reciprocity in the relationship: just as He is there for us, we are there for Him. Or, should be there for Him. In that sense, "Hum Sai Ke" is a prompt for introspection. Are we really there for Him, willing to do whatever He asks of us? Can He count on us? Do we love Him unconditionally? The questions beg reflection, and are worth pondering when we sing "Sai Hamara Hum Sai Ke".

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Dasara Divine Discourse: Inner Significance of the Navarathri Festival

Sri Sathya Sai Speaks Vol 25, September 27, 1992


Navarathri means nine nights. Darkness is associated with night. What is this darkness? It is the darkness of ignorance. The purpose of the Navarathri celebration is to enable man to get rid of nine types of darkness which have taken hold of him. When a reference is made to Devi, it signifies the unified form of Durga, Lakshmi and Saraswathi. The three together represent Shakthi. Shakthi is the energy that accounts for all the phenomena of *Prakruthi* (Nature).

Nature is energy and the controller of that energy is the Lord. *Prakruthi* (Nature) is made up of the three qualities, Sathwa, Rajas and Thamas. Saraswathi represents the Sathya Guna. Lakshmi represents the Rajo Guna and Parvathi represents the Thamo Guna. As *Prakruthi* (Nature) is made up of these three qualities (Sathwa, Rajas and Thamas), to get control over Nature, man has been offering worship to Durga, Lakshmi and Saraswathi. These are not goddesses but deified symbols of the three qualities.

The role of Nature in the creative process

To acquire the grace of the Lord, man has to offer worship at the outset to *Prakruthi* (Nature). On the one hand you need human effort and on the other you have to acquire the grace of the Divine. *Prakruthi* (Nature) and Paramatma (the Omni-Self) are like the negative and positive poles in electricity. However powerful the Lord may be (as the positive pole), there can be no creation without Prakruthi (representing the negative pole).

The basis for creation is *Prakruthi*. For instance, however good the seeds you may have with you, without planting them in the ground you cannot reap the fruit. The role of Nature in the creative process is similar. When man forgets God and desires to enjoy the benefits of Nature, he becomes ultimately a



demon like Ravana who brought about his own destruction. To secure the grace of the Lord, one has to have purity of the heart, purity in speech and purity in action. This triple purity is described in Vedantic parlance as Tripurasundari. Lakshmi, who is the embodiment of all prosperity, is represented by the heart. The mouth represents Saraswathi. Kriya Shuddhi (Purity in action) is represented by Durga. The observance of the *Navarathri* celebration is to get rid of the darkness in which man is enveloped, by cultivating the triple purity of thought, word and deed.

The human body emerged from Nature. Nature has two forms: Apara Prakruthi and Para Prakruthi. Apara

Prakruthi includes Ashta Aishwaryas (eight forms of wealth), and Kama, Krodha, Moha, Lobha, Mada, Matsarya and the three mental faculties in man: Manas, Chitta and Ahamkara. Para Prakruthi (the higher Nature) represents the consciousness in man. Without the Prana (life force) and Chaithanyam (consciousness) man is only a corpse. True humanness consists in controlling the five elements which make up the Apara Prakruthi (lower Nature) and merge in the higher Nature represented by the life force and Chaithanyam (consciousness).



Maintain steadiness of mind during worship

The Navarathri has been divided into three parts the first three days being dedicated to the worship of Durga, the next three days to the worship of Lakshmi and the last three days to the worship of Saraswathi. All Hindu festivals have a sacred purpose. Unfortunately, nowadays the festivals are observed only with external rituals without understanding their inner meaning. In the performance of all forms of worship there should be steadiness of mind and body. Only then concentration can be achieved. Today men are unable to maintain steadiness of body and mind. (At this stage Swami referred to the advent of Shirdi

(At this stage Swami referred to the advent of Shirdi Sai and described incidents from his early life. This part of Swami's discourse is published separately in the next chapter. Towards the end of His discourse, Swami again reverted to an exposition of the inner significance of the Dasara festival).

The basic significance of Devi *Navarathri* is the adoration of *Prakruthi* (Nature). Devi refers to Bhudevi (Mother Earth). All the vital requirements of man can be found in the earth. Those who travel to the moon have to carry with them the oxygen, water and food they need from the earth. None of these can be found on the moon.

Students! The progress of modern technology, by polluting the atmosphere with Carbon dioxide smoke, is causing a threat to life on earth. This smoke has already created a hole in the ozone ring above the earth which has been serving as a protecting cover against harmful radiation from the sun. If the ozone layer is destroyed, the effect of the sun's rays may be disastrous. All nations are now worried about this threat. All that needs to be done to avert this danger is to reduce the pollution of the atmosphere caused by automobiles and industrial effluents. The uncontrolled development of industries has to be checked. Development should be in the common interest, to promote the welfare of all.

The *Navarathri* celebration is an occasion for revering Nature and considering how natural resources can be used properly in the best interests of mankind. Resources like water, air, power and minerals should be used properly and not misused or wasted. Economy in the use of every natural resource is vital. Pollution of the air has many evil consequences. The inner significance of observances like Nagarasankirtan and bhajans is to fill the atmosphere with sacred vibrations and holy thoughts.

Today we know how radio and television broadcasts are transmitted to all parts of the world by radio waves. Is it unbelievable that Krishna was able


similarly to appear in the homes of Gopikas simultaneously? If a Yantra (machine) could achieve such a result, how much more power should be attributed to Mantra? The power of the divine name and form is all pervading. The electromagnetic waves in the atmosphere can preserve sounds and forms for all time.

When Swami was recently in Hyderabad, His activities there were seen on the TV in various parts of the country. If a mechanical contrivance could achieve this, is it incredible that much more could be done by the divine power of manthras? What is needed is the power to tune in to the Spirit just as appropriate tuning is needed to receive a radio or TV broadcast. Regard your heart as a radio receiver. Your concentration is the tuning device. You will experience the Divine when you tune your heart properly. This calls for firm, unwavering concentration. The

inauguration of the *Navarathri* celebrations means that you should use this occasion for offering worship to Nature and resolving to make sacred use of all natural resources.

The mere removal of hate from the heart will not ensure Ananda (bliss). Love too should be cultivated. That is to say, uproot hate and plant love. If the absence of hate ensures Bhakthi, hill and anthill, tree and twig, mud and mountain - what do these hate? They have no dislikes. But for this reason, do we ascribe Bhakthi to them at all? We do not, for that would be absurd. The Bhaktha must first be free from hate and full of Love.

Hate breeds fear, hate is the seedbed of anxiety, scandal and falsehood. It drains your mind of peace. You may have light without oil, fire without smoke, breeze without a bearer fanning you, a chilliness in the air of your room in the sizzling heat of summer - but, unless you are at peace with yourselves and with those around you, your pulse will be quick and your blood will be racing in rage and rancor. Love alone can alleviate anxiety and allay fear.





The "Red and Gold" Ganesha: How to Joyously Revel in His Grace

"I love Ganesha. I don't know why but I am crazy about Him! I have loads of pictures of Him – really exquisite ones which you might not have seen anywhere! I like anything about Him!"

These are not the words of a Ganesha devotee or a person steeped in Indian culture and spirituality. They are the words of a widely travelled, international media consultant, who is non-religious and keeps her distance from any discussions on God, rituals and religion.

What is awe-inspiring about the elephant-faced Lord is His universal appeal. Are you aware that Ganesha is on the currency of Indonesia which incidentally is an Islamic state?

In the Vedic hymn *Ganapati Atharva Sheersham,* Ganesha is described as *'Jagat Karanam Achyutam...'* i.e., "He, the Imperishable One,

descended within the manifested universe for the welfare of the world during the beginning of creation."

Another description of Ganesha in the *Ganapati*Atharva Sheersham is: "Raktam Lambodaram
Shoorpakarnakam Raktvaasasam, Rakta
Gandhaanu Liptaangam, Rakta Pushpai
Supoojitam", i.e., The one "With a round stomach,
He is blood red in color. He has elephant ears and is
attired in red clothes. He is smeared with red
sandalwood paste and decorated with red flowers."

This set me thinking, as in this verse everything about Ganesha is described to have a reddish glow. But none of the statues of this Lord at *Prasanthi Nilayam* are red in color. Our adorable Ganesha at the entrance of our *Prasanthi Nilayam* ashram is black while the one at the *Gopuram* Gate entrance has a golden hue. The Ganesha who was earlier in the *darshan* ground in *Prasanthi Nilayam* was white. (This was before the Sai Kulwant Hall was built.)

When the Vedas describe Him as being red, why then don't we see more of red Ganeshas? This made me very curious!

The Ganesha Created by The Father

I went to sleep one night with these thoughts, in January 2018. The next morning, I woke up with this question still ringing in my mind. Suddenly my eyes fell on the little library I have in my room. Almost involuntarily, my hands went to the book, *Life is a Challenge, Meet it!* by Mrs. Joy Thomas. To my pleasant surprise, in it was a

chapter called, 'Ganapati, the Remover of Obstacles'. Imagine my joy and delight when the chapter opened up and I read these lines by the author:


"My first reaction to the image was one of utter delight in its beauty. The craftsmanship is of course unequalled. The red cloisonné and red gemstones which make up His garment are striking against the background of gold."

This was the description of a Ganesha that Bhagawan had Himself manifested for the author. When I turned that page, I froze! It had the photo of the Ganesha Swami had specially created for Mrs Joy—and this Ganesha matched the description mentioned in the Vedas to perfection!

He was shining in red and gold. His garments were made of red stones. Not only His crown, even His necklace was red. His body shone in gold. It was an exquisite piece of art!

The author further wrote, "I wasn't clear why Baba chose this particular gift for me... of course my husband Raye had asked Swami once again to help with my knees. The moment Raye told Bhagawan to do something about my knees, He said, "I know. I know. She doesn't like having to be in that wheel chair."

The next second Swami's hand went up in the air and onto His hand came this enchanting Ganesha. Bhagawan then said, "Ganapati heals all diseases, overcomes all difficulties, solves all problems and removes all obstacles." Saying this, Swami placed this lovely red Ganesha on her palm and added, "Put it in your bag." So Mrs Joy placed it in a small pouch and wore it around her neck. They were leaving for California that day.



Once they got into the plane, an in-flight movie was going on. It was a good story and Joy started watching it keenly. Suddenly, two kids who were sitting in the front got up on their seats and blocked her view completely. After a while they settled down but a few minutes later the children stood up again. It seemed as if they were going to stand forever.



She completed this prayer and in the next instant there was an announcement by the pilot: "The control panel is showing a light. So, the plane is going to be delayed by a few minutes." Five minutes passed, and the captain came on air again: "Now we will take off." At that moment, a steward came hurriedly to Mr. Thomas to say: "We are so happy to inform you that your baggage is on board. During the short delay, they were delivered. They are safe in the luggage compartment."

Mr. and Mrs. Thomas looked at each other in wonder: "Was this another coincidence?"

"This time the circumstances were not as trivial as before, still it was not an earth-shaking matter," Joy thought and felt, "Perhaps my dependence on God on everyday affairs had been too limited. Maybe this is what Baba wants me to learn."

Once they reached home, there was a mountain of mail to be seen and cleared. One was from the Internal Revenue Service. Everyone dreaded mail from the IRS. The couple wondered why this was happening, as they were diligent in paying their taxes and complying with the rules of the land.

Mrs Shirley was Mrs Joy's friend and co-worker who had a huge estate and a 14-year-old daughter. Before she passed away in 1974, she gave the management of the estate as well as the guardianship of her daughter to Mrs Thomas.

When the daughter of Mrs Shirley turned 25, Joy transferred the estate and all the assets to her and dissolved the trust. Even though all the accounting was done and relevant documents had been submitted, the government was asking for some papers concerning tax returns.

Mrs Joy called the IRS office multiple times to clarify but their phone was always busy. **Finally, she sought her Ganesha's help** and tried one more time. Still, to her utter dismay, she could not get through the connection.

This was the first time her prayers to Ganesha had not worked. Now this was an important matter unlike the previous occasions. She wished that she could trace some papers relating to the estate. Once the final accounting was done and the transfer was complete, she had discarded all the documents.

In a desperate attempt, she once again randomly put her hand into her records closet. To her amazement, her fingers fell on a document which was vital for that transaction. She had no clue how it got there as she had destroyed everything concerning the estate.

Having got this important paper, she called the IRS office again. Now the line connected! With the help of the document, she answered all the queries and the problem was solved right there and then. In fact, a few weeks later, there was even a polite note from the IRS thanking her and complimenting her for her diligence.

Pondering over this incident, Mrs Joy writes, "I wondered whether or not Ganesha had given me the help that I needed, even though it was not the help I asked for... I learned that Ganesha not only clears the path for our *dharmic* activity, He also blocks our way when we are not choosing correctly."

Many people told Mrs Joy that when it comes to the IRS, a telephone call will not do, one has to submit everything in writing. But in her case, instead of her writing to the IRS, the IRS wrote to her praising her conscientiousness!

Prayer Must be a Call of Love

In the *Ganapati Atharva Sheersham*, Ganesha is also described as "*Bhaktanu Kampinam Daivam*", i.e., "The Lord whose heart throbs for His devotees!" When His devotee is in trouble, the Lord is restless; His heart indeed beats only for His devotees.

Mrs Joy further adds, "I began to realize that Swami was increasing my faith in a God of Love who was willing to help each one of us even in the smallest of difficulties in our lives. He was also bringing me closer to the ideal of 'Praying Without Ceasing'. He once said in a group interview, 'Prayer is everything'.

They say prayer is not a spare wheel that you put out when you are in trouble. It is a steering wheel that directs the right path throughout your life. Often, we look at our resources in comparison to our challenges and become anxious. But when we pray, we see the enormity of God's resources, then all our fears just melt away.


Bhagawan beautifully says: "Prayer alone makes life happy, harmonious and worth living in this universe."

The Sweetness of Krishna

Swami's Words and the Madhurashtakam



Every Krishna Jayanthi, when the birth of Lord Krishna is celebrated, Prasanthi Nilayam's Sai Kulwant Hall is filled with the sweet sounds of the Madhurashtakam, composed by Sri Vallabhacharya (15th century) and regularly sung by Sai students even today, as they did in Swami's Divine presence prior to the Mahasamadhi. Presented below, the song extols every aspect and feature of Krishna, concluding each of its eight verses with "everything of the master of Mathura is sweetness indeed".

Why was the Krishna Avatar so "sweet"? Swami has talked about Krishna's sweetness in several discourses. In the following enlightening excerpts, Swami talks of how Krishna's sweetness led His devotees to yearn and thirst for Him and cling to Him, to the exclusion of all things worldly, ultimately to merge in Him and attain the highest bliss and peace.

Swami's Words

"In order to save man, the Lord appeared in a most charming Form, so, that He could draw His heart in love - 'Raso vai sah' (He is sweetness itself). So, Krishna easily steals into the hearts of even the most hard-hearted individuals. He is the 'bada chitha

chor' (the greatest thief of hearts). The heart yearns for His voice, His Form, His flute, His smile, His sport and His pranks. That is the *thapas* (penance) which is rewarded by His grace. The yearning is so deep that all body-consciousness is lost, the senses are ineffective, and the mind is inactive, the intelligence is at a standstill, ideas of duality disappear. The individual sees before him only step after step of *Anandha* (bliss) leading him to the highest bliss of merging in Him.

Sri Sathya Sai Speaks, Volume 8, 1968

"Think of the sublimely sweet Love that Krishna evoked in the hearts of...His contemporaries! Every one of them, from the unlettered cowherd to the most profound scholar and sage, was drawn to Him as by a magnet and held by Him in unshakeable devotion. Whatever the hardships and troubles that came upon them, they did not give up His Lotus Feet, to which they clung ever fast and firmly. As you walk along the road, your shadow follows you, through dirt and dust, bush and bramble, mound and midden, brook and boulder. But, note how the shadow has constant contact with the Feet. So long as the shadow (man) has fast and firm contact with the Feet of the Substance (the Lord), no hardship can affect him. Hold on to the Lord; that is the way to peace and joy. "

Sri Sathya Sai Speaks, Volume 8, 1968

"Thirst for Krishna is the healthiest and most conducive to peace. Thirst for Krishna—for seeing Him, hearing Him, His Flute, for installing Him in the heart, in the mind, for grasping His Reality through the intellect - this thirst is the healthiest, the most conducive to peace. Devotion to Krishna is the chain by which the monkey mind can be fastened and subdued. Transmute all the desire with which the senses torment you into the thirst for Krishna and you are saved.



The Sweetness of Krishna (cont)

Krish means attract, draw. Even a confirmed [believer in the Universal Absolute without name and form] confesses that the attraction for the playful child on the Yamuna sands is irresistible. [Another scholar] declares that though the *Shasthras* taught him the truth of the Nameless Absolute, his heart taught him to revere the Cowherd Boy with the Flute. He prays that, when he draws his last breath, the Fair Child of Brindavan with the Feather Flute and Flower might smile on him and bless him.

Krishna draws the mind away from sensory desires; that is another way in which the draw operates. He pulls the mind towards him and so, they are pulled away from everything else, for everything else is inferior, less valuable. He satisfies the deepest thirst of man, for peace, joy and wisdom. That is why He is Meghashyama - dark-blue as the rain cloud. The very sight of the rain-laden cloud is so refreshing. He is lotus-eyed, lotus-palmed, lotus-soled; the lotus is reminiscent of cool, calm, deep lakes of limpid water, the water that quenches thirst. When Krishna-thrishna is guenched, the highest Anandha is attained; there is no more need, no more want. The urge to drink inferior drinks...disappears once the sweetness of Krishna nama (name) and Krishna bhava (thought) are tasted...Radha, Godha, Meera, Chaithanya, Ramakrishna, Surdas - they knew the nectarine taste of that Name."

Sri Sathya Sai Speaks, Vol 6, 1966

"[How to cultivate thirst for Krishna?] The thirst for Krishna is a sign of health in the spiritual field. Not to have it is a sign of bhava roga - the fell disease that afflicts worldly persons, the symptoms being grief, discontent, pain and worry, even when wealth and health are endowed. That thirst can be cultivated by...reading scriptures, cultivating good company, learning lessons from a kind Guru and regular practice of japam (meditation). Once it is acquired, the thirst itself will lead you on to places and persons



able to quench it. That is the advantage of spiritual quest; the first step makes the second easy.

Mere repetition of the name, Krishna, will be of no use, unless the contemplation of the Glory of Krishna starts purifying the character at the same time. Thus, manava (human) becomes Madhava (divine). Mruthyu (death) is changed into Amritha (immortality). Through thanmaya, (saturated with Divinity), this mrinmaya (mud-filled body) becomes Chinmaya (saturated with Divine consciousness) - through saturation, this clod becomes God. That is the consummation of Krishnathrishna, the thirst after God, which wells up in one's own heart.

Spiritual GPS Good Practices for Sadhana

"Be Happy Always!" - But How?



One of Swami's most frequently uttered *maha-vakyas* (great sayings) is the injunction "Be Happy Always!". Sounds easy! But for too many of us, the smallest of things can sap a smile and furrow a brow. Ruing the past and fearing the future, we ruin the present. Bad news, bad health, bad friends, bad weather, bad food, bad luck, even bad genes—every time we encounter a "bad" in our lives, our good intentions, to follow Swami's dictum, vanish.

Why be happy always? Because it is a Pre-requisite. For...Self-realization! This GPS offers tips on how to attain happiness. But one might first ask: Why? Swami says that "happiness is essential for God-realization and is one of the major gateways to Divinity. [Being unhappy] is not just a fault, it is one of the most serious of all faults. It is a barrier to Realization." (Conversations with Sai, March 3, 2006). He also points out that happiness is indeed man's inherent, divine nature. He Himself, He points out, is ever happy.

But how be happy always amid life's often turbulent waters? Here are nine practical ways, drawn from Swami's discourses.

- Curb your desires: remember that happiness derived from worldly objects is fleeting and that as desires grow, so do worry and anxiety. "Desires are never-ending, like the waves of the sea", says Swami.
- Swami says, "Offer your salutations to God. Without doing this, you will...collapse into the endless cycle of birth and death...Your tears of gratitude will liberate you from all such problems. You will always be blissful, with cheerful smiles. This is the result of constantly expressing your gratitude to God."
- **▼ Curb your ego:** the more you lose the "I" and the desires, the more you will find peace. Swami has said, "As long as you have attachment and ego, you can never…experience Atmic bliss".
- ▼ Be content: do not constantly compare yourself to others. Swami says, "Try to understand your true nature. Do not compare yourself with others. Follow your own conscience and enjoy bliss. Do not imitate others. Imitation is the quality of the weak-minded."
- Serve others: nothing gives greater joy than bringing joy and comfort to others. "Those anxious to live in joy must always be doing good", Swami has said.




Spiritual GPS Good Practices for Sadhana

Maintain equanimity: remember that pain and pleasure come and go; also, see things in perspective and do not allow small things to steal your joy. "Consider pain and pleasure as passing clouds... Worldly pleasure is transient...Man should maintain equanimity in pleasure and pain, loss or gain. Without pain you cannot enjoy pleasure", says Swami.



- Choose to be happy, even in rough times: remember that happiness comes from within, from the inner you or divinity. "The eternal truth is that there is only one everlasting, never-failing happiness, and that is God. You are God, and to drink deeply of that ever-flowing spring of happiness, you must turn to yourself, to the Divine Atma, which—however obscured—is always the resident of your heart, the subtle truth of your being."
- Remember that each day is a gift of God: every "present" is a present; do not waste it. "What matters is to live in the present, live now, for every moment is now. It is your thoughts and acts of the moment that create your future."
- ▶ Let go of worry, and put your faith in God: remember at all times that He is in control, and that whatever happens in your life is happening in accordance with His will. Swami explains, "Each worry is like a naya paisa. One rupee is equal to 100 naya paise, and 100 rupees are equal to 10,000 naya paise. When you make a bundle of 10,000 naya paise, it is quite heavy and not easy to carry. Therefore, the Lord says, give me those 10,000 naya paise and I will give you a 100 rupee note, which is very light, is easy to carry, and can safely be preserved."

5. The Real Significance of the Lotus Feet

Swami says:

To earn the grace of the Divine, the easy way is surrendering to the Feet of the Lord. The Feet, which were washed by Brahma, the Creator, the Feet which were worshipped by Bharatha through Rama's sandals, which ruled the kingdom of Ayodhya for 14 years, should be your object of worship.

There is so much power in the feet of the Lord which you cannot understand. The feet form the basis for not only the physical frame of the body, but also for spiritual and ethical purposes. The significance of each limb of the body is explained in Vedanta. The five senses of the body represent the five elements (sound is ether, touch is air, vision is fire, taste is water and smell is earth).

In the *Purusha Sukta*, the body of the Divine is described in detail. The four *varnas* in society are represented by four parts of the Cosmic Person *Brahmanas*, *Kshatriyas*, *Vaishyas and Shudras*. It is the Feet that support the entire body, comprising the other three classes. So, the Feet are an important part of the body. The real significance of Feet is not properly understood by all.

The Vedas proclaim the unity of all classes of people by describing them as limbs of one body. The Vedas declare that "Ekatma Sarvabhuta Antaratma" (same Atma is present in all beings).

The Vedas elucidate the importance of the Feet. Even in ordinary life we advise a person who has harmed another to fall at the latter's feet and beg his pardon to escape legal action. There is a close link between the different parts of the body. When one walks on the road, if the eye sees a thorn, the legs avoid treading on it. When the foot is injured, the eye sheds tears. There is such close co-ordination in the physical body. Similarly in the body of the Divine, the *Brahmanas*, *Kshatriyas*, *Vaishyas and Shudras* form an integral part. If a *Shudra* is in trouble, the *Brahmana* should be concerned. When such feelings develop in the world, there will be peace and harmony in society. Everyone should realise this and foster unity.

Embodiments of Love! The *Prema tatva* (Love principle) is within you. What you are practising now as love is not real love. It is only affection out of *Anuraga* (attachment to the body). Real Love is unchanging. The feeling

Prahlada's son was Virochana, and the hero of the story behind the Onam festival was the son of Virochana. He was named Balichakravarthi (Bali, the Emperor). Being the grandson of the devout Prahlada, Bali too was engaged in the glorification of God and in the material and spiritual uplift of his subjects. There was no trace of poverty or ill health in his empire. Every home was lit with joy; every day was a festive occasion.

He decided to celebrate an elaborate sacrificial rite called Viswajith, which would propitiate the Gods so much that, with their blessings, he could extend his beneficent rule over the entire world. The Lord utilized this opportunity to shower Grace on him. He incarnated as Vamana and proceeded to the sacrificial altar in the form of a mendicant student, just initiated into spiritual life. Bali was happy to welcome Him. When Vamana was asked which gift he would accept, He replied that he needed only three feet of ground, measured by His feet. Bali was surprised at this answer. For a short second, he doubted the intention and identity of the strange visitor. His preceptor, Sukra, warned him against promising to agree. But Bali stood by his word. He permitted Vamana to measure for Himself the three feet of ground..."

The Lord as Vamana then covered the entire earth with one step, the sky with the second, and was waiting to take the third step. But there was no space left for the third step.

What do you think Emperor Bali did then?

7. The Deadly Dance of the Lotus Feet

Swami describes the dance of Krishna on the hood of Kaliya.

Avatar OR Formless God?

The following "Conversation with Sai" is excerpted from Satyopanishad, Part 18: Directions from the Divine.

Prof. Anil Kumar: Swami! Some say that God has no form. But, we see devotees praying to idols in temples. The concept of Avatar, the incarnation of God, is of special significance in our land of Sanathana Dharma. But followers of other paths argue that God has no form. We pray to you to clarify this point.

Swami: When you see a doctor, you will be reminded of your physical complaints. When you meet a lawyer, you think of litigation and court cases, don't you? Likewise, when you see a gopuram, temple tower, you will be reminded of God. As I often say: love may not have a form, but a loving mother has. Water may not have form, but the tumbler with water has a form; air may not have a form, but the balloon into which it is pumped has a form. In the same manner, the formless divine has its form or forms. The formless expresses itself through a form.



A simple example: You know the screen in a theatre. You find pictures projected on the screen. In every picture, there is the screen. Without the screen, you can't see the picture. Pictures come and pass. Not even one remains permanent. This screen may be described in spiritual parlance as 'sat' and 'asat' or 'satasat'. 'Sat' is existence, 'asat' is non-existence. Like this, these two coexist, sakara, one with form, and nirakara, the formless.








